MARKET SITUATION

Europe: Trade in pork legs took place at increased prices this week. Shoulders and by-products were also sold at increased prices ,driven largely by good exports to China. Other cuts were at largely unchanged prices.

UK: Trade in the UK bacon market remains stable.

Third countries: A good trade continues to be reported with China and Japan, but quieter business in other markets.

Import ban extended

Russia is to extend its import ban for a large number of food and agricultural products from western Europe until the end of 2017, the Russian Prime Minister, Dmitrij Medvedev, announced last Friday.

The news came after the G7 countries announced their intention to continue their sanctions against Russia

The Russian ban does not cover trim and by-products. These products are excluded because of the disagreement between the EU and Russian authorities on the control of African Swine Fever.

A meeting took place between the Russian Agriculture Minister, Alexander Tkachev, and the EU Health Commissioner, Vytenis Andriukaitis, during which the disagreement over the control of ASF was discussed for the first time for a considerable period.

Country labelling for processed products

Minister of Agriculture, Stephane Le Foll, have been pressing the EU Commission to introduce some form of country labelling for processed products. The Commission has so far rejected the request because it would increase costs for the industry and it is doubtful whether consumers would be prepared to pay for these additional costs.

However, the EU Commission is expected to look favourably on France's request that, for a trial period from 31 December 2018, country labelling for milk and meat used in processed products will be introduced.

Higher production costs

Feed costs are continuing to rise for Brazilian pig producers. According to data from the Central Intelligence Agency for Poultry and Swine, the overall costs of pig production this year had risen by nearly 10% up to the end of April and were nearly 25% higher than a year ago.

Due to the falling exchange rate, exports of maize have increased, leading to a lack of local supplies ad higher feed costs. The decline in domestic stocks of maize has meant higher imports from neighbours Argentina and Paraguay.

The situation is expected to ease in the middle of the year with the second of the two annual harvests.

Seaboard Foods and Triumph Foods join forces in the establishment of a new pig slaughterhouse Last week, Seaboard Foods and Triumph Foods announced that they are investing in a joint venture to establish a new pig slaughterhouse in Sioux City, Iowa. The plan is for the new slaughterhouse to kill around 3 million pigs per year and to become operational in 2017. It will operate on a shift basis and employ around 1,100 workers, approximately 900 of whom will be hourly paid.

Triumph Foods is owned by pig producers, while Seaboard Foods is a subsidiary of Seaboard Corporation. Both companies already operate a joint pig production, slaughtering and sales operation. If merged, the combined group would be the second largest US pig producer, as well as a major pig slaughtering organisation and exporter
