Fall in hog futures

As can be seen on page 2 of Market News, Chinese futures prices have plunged in recent days.

The fall is due to farmers destocking their herds in recent weeks, reports Reuters, which has affected market confidence.

"Large companies are reducing herds due to financial pressure after a year of deep losses while smaller farmers are also selling due to increasing outbreaks of African Swine Fever," said Darin Friedrichs, cofounder of Shanghai-based Sitonia Consulting.

The negative price trend has resulted in the Chinese authorities announcing the third purchase of pig meat this year for state reserves.

According to Reuters, the Chinese Agriculture Ministry has also announced that China's sow population at 42.1 million is higher than the authorities wish it to be. The Ministry will seek to create a more stable and sensible level of pig production through supportive policies.



British pig meat can be exported to California under Proposition 12 regulations

British pig meat with Red Tractor Certification has been approved as meeting Californian welfare regulations (Proposition 12), reports Pig333 and The Pig Site.

This means that from 1 January 2024, British pig meat can be exported to consumers in California.

"I'm delighted that we can now offer British pig farmers access to this important market for selling safe and traceable UK pork," says Jim Moseley, CEO, Red Tractor.

"We have explored all the different options for achieving this, including whether the CDFA could simply recognise the Red Tractor scheme directly. However, Californian legislation requires CDFA certification. This is why the news that the British NSF has now been certified by CDFA is so significant.

"As part of the existing Red Tractor scheme, producers will be able to add the Prop 12 checks, where required, and have access to this important market for their pork."

It is also reported in The Pig Site that California consumes 15 per cent of all US pork, but only produces 1 per cent.



Pig meat storage 14 per cent lower than one year ago

With the USDA as the source, the table below shows the latest figures for U.S. pig meat storage as at 31 October compared to last month and one year ago.

Total pig meat storage was 14 per cent lower than one year ago. Compared to the previous month, storage was down by 6 per cent.

Beef storage as at 31 October was 6 per cent higher than the previous month but 13 per cent lower than one year ago. As regards poultry, storage fell by 6 per cent from the previous month and is on a par with one year ago.
