Rise in U.S. pig meat exports in H1 – but down on two years ago

With U.S. export statistics as the source, the table below shows U.S. exports of pig meat by country for H1 2023 compared to the same period in the previous two years. Exports are grouped into fresh/frozen, by-products and processed pig meat.

As can be seen, compared to a year ago, there has been a rise in US exports of fresh/frozen pig meat and by-products. This applies to all the major U.S. pig meat markets.

Exports of fresh/frozen pig meat are, however, somewhat below the level of two years ago when the figures were positively influenced by substantial exports to China.

By contrast, U.S. exports of processed pig meat were somewhat lower in the first half of the year than in the same period last year.

Smithfield to close 35 farms in Missouri in October

In May, the U.S. media reported that Smithfield planned to close a number of the company's sow farms in Missouri.

Smithfield did not wish to comment on the report at the time, but now the company has announced that it will shut down 35 pig farms in Missouri from 8 October. The closure means that 92 employees will be made redundant.



Rise in pig meat exports

The Brazilian Animal Protein Association (ABPA) reports that substantial exports of pig meat have continued in 2023.

According to calculations from ABPA, pig meat exports for the first seven months of the year stand at 695,000 tonnes, 14.6 per cent higher than the same period last year. According to value, exports rose by 24.3 per cent.

🧧 BRAZIL

The Dominican Republic gives the go-ahead to pig meat from Brazil

The Brazilian Animal Protein Association (ABPA) reports that the Dominican Republic has given the goahead to pig meat from Brazil.

Three plants in the states of Acre, Santa Catarina and Rio Grande do Sul will pave the way. However, a number of other plants are expected to be approved in the near future.

ABPA forecasts a reasonably good level of exports to the new market going forward.

After the Dominican Republic was hit by African Swine Fever in 2021, the country has seen a rise in pig meat exports. As can be seen on page 3, the U.S. has also been increasing its exports of pig meat to the Dominican Republic since 2021.

GERMANY

6 per cent fall in meat production in H1 2023

AMI reports that German meat production in H1 2023 stood at 3.3 million tonnes, 6 per cent lower than the same period last year.

The fall can be solely attributed to pig meat production, which fell by 9.4 per cent to 2.06 million tonnes. German poultry production was almost unchanged at 0.771 million tonnes while beef production rose by 0.9 per cent to 0.481 million tonnes.

GERMANY

June's figures show low level of pig meat storage continues

The latest figures from AMI for German storage of frozen pig meat in June stood at 79,000 tonnes.

The June figures, therefore, continue to show a fall in German pig meat storage. In May, storage stood at 85,000 tonnes and in April at 100,000 tonnes.

Since May 2022, when storage stood at 212,000 tonnes, there has been a strong downward trend in German pig meat storage.

The AMI figures are based on Germany's trade association for cold stores.
