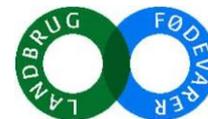

 **SPAIN**
**African Swine Fever**

The most recent count from the Spanish authorities shows that the number of wild boar that have died from African Swine Fever has now risen to 162, seven more than last week.

As one infected wild boar was found outside the current high-risk zone, the zone is being expanded once again.

The expansion of the zone has necessitated a redoubling of the containment measures. The region is maintaining its original strategy, but has requested extraordinary support from the state to strengthen resources in the newly affected areas.

The export situation as regards open and closed markets is unchanged. Around 60 per cent of exports to countries outside the EU remain open whereas around 40 per cent of the markets remain closed. The closed markets correspond to an annual export volume of around 530,000 tonnes.

 **SOUTH AFRICA**
**Pigmeat production under pressure from Foot & Mouth and African Swine Fever**

Pigmeat production in South Africa is under pressure due to Foot and Mouth disease and African Swine Fever, reports Pig 333.

A rise in mortality and the culling of animals at infected farms has resulted in a fall in production and rising pig prices. From the end of May 2025 until the end of January 2026, the pig price rose by around 26 per cent. Supply is expected to be under pressure throughout 2026.

 **PHILIPPINES**
**Fewer farms hit by African Swine Fever**

The authorities in the Philippines have announced a sharp decline in the number of farms affected by African Swine Fever, reports Pig Progress.

Between the end of December 2025 and the end of January 2026, official figures show that the number of provinces reporting outbreaks fell from 11 to four. In January, only eight barangays/villages reported outbreaks compared to 98 barangays/villages in December.

The Philippine authorities are optimistic about the decline continuing throughout 2026 – a trend brought about by the roll-out of a comprehensive vaccination programme.

 **AUSTRIA**
**Continued decline in the Austrian pig population**

Statistics Austria has published the latest figures for the country's pig population as at 1 December 2025. These show that the total population fell by 2.2 per cent compared to the previous year. Over the same period, the breeding herd declined by 2.9 per cent. Austrian pig production therefore continues the downward trend of previous years.

The number of pig farms also saw a fall. The total stood at 15,800 farms on 1 December, which corresponds to a fall of 4.7 per cent compared to one year ago. There were slightly more pigs per farm than in the previous year.

### Increase in EU pigmeat exports in 2025

With the EU Commission as the source and based on data from Eurostat's database (Comext), the tables below show EU pigmeat exports by category, importer and exporter for the whole of 2025 compared with 2024.

Spain increased its exports outside the EU by 2 per cent in 2025. When taking into account the monthly figure, Spanish exports fell by almost 20 per cent in December 2025 compared to December 2024. In December 2025, less was exported to China, Japan and the Philippines, while exports to South Korea and Vietnam increased significantly compared to the previous year.

Denmark increased its exports outside the EU by 8 per cent in 2025 compared to 2024. There were significant increases to Philippines, Taiwan and Ukraine.

 **GERMANY**
**Stable meat production in 2025**

The German authorities have calculated Germany at 6.9 million tonnes in 2025 - a modest fall of 0.2 per cent compared to 2024.

Pigmeat production increased by 1.1 per cent in 2025 and accounts for almost two-thirds of total meat production. This follows as the result of a rise in domestic production, while imports of finishers fell in 2025.

Beef production fell by 6.0 per cent in 2025 while poultry production was unchanged on the year.

Meat production in Germany peaked in 2016 at 8.3 million tonnes. Since then, production has fallen by 17.0 per cent.

 **UK**
**A slight fall in the UK's pig production expected in 2026 and 2027**

AHDB (Agriculture Horticulture and Development Board) has published its forecast for the UK's production and trade in pigmeat, producer prices and pigmeat consumption for 2026.

Production in 2026 is forecast to reach 972,000 tonnes, a 0.3 per cent decline year-on-year, with heavier carcass weights partially offsetting lower slaughter numbers. Looking ahead to 2027, carcass weights are expected to stabilise at the same level as in 2026, while the slaughtering is expected to fall further. Overall, production in 2027 is expected to be 1.3 per cent lower than in 2026.

The development is due in part to an expected reduction in the breeding herd. Many producers are expected to prepare for the upcoming legal requirements for more space in farrowing pens, which will require substantial investments to maintain current herd sizes.

In the global market, geopolitical tension and disease outbreaks are expected to create uncertainty. China's import requirements will fall while major producers, such as Brazil and the U.S., will put pressure on prices in Asian markets.

The outbreak of African Swine Fever in Spain has also forced EU prices down and increased the price difference between the EU and UK. As a result, AHDB expects imports into the UK to remain stable or rise slightly, while exports are expected to fall by 1-2 per cent.

At the start of 2026, British pigmeat prices are at their lowest level in three years, impacted by the major price falls in the EU. AHDB estimates, however, that there may be some opportunities of support for UK prices in the second half of 2026 if domestic demand remains strong.

Pigmeat consumption is expected to rise by 2 per cent in 2026, primarily driven by growth in the retail sector. To an increasing extent, consumers are expected to opt for pigmeat as it is less expensive than beef and therefore an attractive option at a time when household budgets are squeezed.



UK

### Fall in imports and rise in exports of pigmeat in 2025

AHDB has published the trade figures for the UK's import and export of pigmeat for 2025 compared to 2024.

#### Imports

The figures show that pigmeat imports declined by 4.8 per cent compared to the previous year. The decline covers all categories of pigmeat. UK continues to import the majority of pigmeat from the EU, with Denmark as the largest supplier, followed by Holland and Germany.

Imports from Denmark were stable in 2025 compared to 2024, while imports from Holland declined somewhat.

Imports from Germany were halted at the start of 2025 following an outbreak of Foot & Mouth disease in a herd of water buffalo in Berlin. Trade has since resumed and the level in December 2025 was slightly higher than in December 2024. As a whole, imports from Germany were 26 per cent lower in 2025 compared to 2024.

### Exports

By contrast, exports of British pigmeat increased by 2.6 per cent in 2025 compared with 2024. This is largely due to a rise in exports of frozen pigmeat, sausages and by-products. Exports to China increased by almost 13 per cent, primarily driven by an increase in exports of by-products.

## ARGENTINA

### Pigmeat production rose by 3.4 per cent in 2025

According to Pig 333, which cites official figures from Argentina, pigmeat production in Argentina rose by 3.4 per cent in 2025 to 812,000 tonnes. This is the result of a 2.5 per cent increase in slaughtering and a rise in carcase weight.

Pigmeat exports were at a modest 12,369 tonnes in 2025 – a fall of 14.9 per cent compared with 2024. Imports of pigmeat in 2025 stood at 53,475 tonnes – a strong rise of 135.8 per cent compared to the previous year. Almost all imports come from Brazil.

The rise in imports and in production resulted in an 8.6 per cent increase in pigmeat consumption to 876,000 tonnes in 2025.

 **CHILE**
**Stable pigmeat production in 2025**

According to Pig 333, citing official figures from the Chilean authorities, production of pigmeat in Chile rose by a modest 0.7 per cent in 2025 to 585,000 tonnes.

Exports of pigmeat from Chile amounted to 259,062 tonnes in 2025. This is a fall of 3.4 per cent compared to the previous year when exports amounted to 268,182 tonnes.

Imports of pigmeat to Chile totalled 129,215 tonnes in 2025 – a fall of 1.8 per cent compared to the previous year.

Pigmeat consumption amounted to 459,000 tonnes in 2025. This is a rise of 2.4 per cent compared to 2024 when consumption amounted to 449,000 tonnes.

The USDA expects Chilean production as well as exports and imports of pigmeat to be stable in 2026 compared to 2025. The main markets for Chilean exports are expected to remain China, Japan and South Korea, while imports will come from the U.S. and Brazil.

 **CHINA**
**USDA expects stable Chinese production and falling pigmeat imports in 2026**

The USDA has updated its forecast for China's production, consumption and trade in pigmeat in 2025 and 2026.

According to the updated forecast, Chinese pig production in 2026 is expected to be at around the same level in 2025, while imports are expected to fall further.

USDA has based its 2026 assessment on stable slaughtering figures. Although the number of breeding sows is expected to decline, production is expected to be supported by higher efficiency, more piglets per litter and lower mortality. However, carcass weights are expected to be reduced in 2026 as a result of official efforts to stabilise the market and limit secondary fattening. An increasing share of production comes from large, integrated companies with rising efficiency, while smaller farms are continuing to pull out of the market.

Pigmeat consumption is expected to come under pressure in 2026 due to weaker demand. Although pigmeat remains less expensive than beef, many consumers have decided to reduce their overall meat consumption rather than simply switching between different types of meat.

Pigmeat imports are expected to fall in 2026. This is primarily due to significant domestic production, low prices and subdued demand, which together have reduced the incentive to increase imports.

USDA also expects China's recent anti-dumping duties on a number of pigmeat products from the EU will significantly increase costs for European exporters thereby reducing the EU's exports to China.

American pigmeat continues to be affected by additional tariffs and therefore remains more expensive than many competing products – even after the EU was hit by anti-dumping duties. The USDA therefore expects that the U.S. will have a limited market share in China in 2026.

### Rise in Canada's exports in 2025

With Canada's export statistics as the source, the table below shows Canada's exports of fresh and frozen pigmeat by markets for 2025 compared with 2024 and 2023.

Total exports of fresh/frozen pigmeat rose by 5.3 per cent in 2025, with increases in exports to Japan and Mexico while exports to the U.S., Philippines, South Korea and China declined.

According to Canadian export figures, exports of by-products fell in 2025 compared to 2024 and 2023. The decline is due to a fall in exports to China, but the country remains Canada's largest buyer of by-products.

### **USDA's long-term forecast for American pig production until 2035**

The USDA has published its long-term forecast for America's agricultural production, including pig production, until 2035.

According to the forecast, American pig production is expected to see moderate growth over the coming years. From 2027 to 2035, production is estimated to increase by 11.2 per cent, corresponding to a development from 28.1 billion lbs in 2027 to 31.3 billion lbs in 2035.

Growth in production is expected to be driven by more pigs per litter and an increased average carcass weight.

USDA also expects pigmeat consumption per inhabitant to increase by 4.1 per cent between 2027–2035.

In addition, the ministry expects American pigmeat exports will continue to grow towards 2035. Continued efficiency gains in both primary production and in the processing sector are expected to strengthen the industry's international competitiveness. USDA estimates that exports will increase by 11.2 per cent between 2027–2035.

### **U.S. Secretary of Agriculture proposes higher line speeds at slaughterhouses**

Last week, the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture proposed new rules for the inspection of slaughterhouses, which aim to remove the current maximum line speeds at pig and poultry slaughterhouses.

According to the proposal, slaughterhouses will be allowed to set their own line speeds based on their proven ability to maintain process controls and food safety instead of complying with a maximum speed limit.

In a statement, the Secretary of Agriculture Brooke Rollins said:

"As Secretary, my responsibility is to ensure that American families have access to affordable, safe and abundant food. These updates remove outdated bottlenecks so that we can lower production costs and create greater stability in our food system. By bringing our regulations in line with proven, real-world capabilities, we are supporting a stronger supply chain, giving producers and processors the certainty they need, and helping keep groceries more affordable for every household."

The public now has 60 days to submit comments on the proposed changes.

The National Pork Producers Council has already expressed support for the new rules.



USA

### **Slight decline in U.S. pigmeat exports in 2025**

With American export statistics as the source, the tables below show exports of fresh/frozen pigmeat and by-products by country for 2025 compared with 2024 and 2023.

As can be seen from the figures, exports of fresh/frozen pigmeat fell by 2.5 per cent in 2025 compared to 2024, while exports of by-products declined by 9.3 per cent.

Mexico maintains its position as the U.S.'s largest export market for fresh/frozen pigmeat and exports here rose by 4.9 per cent. There were also increases in American exports to several Latin American countries, but not sufficient to offset the fall in exports to a number of Far Eastern markets.

Exports fell to Japan, South Korea and China, which together with Mexico and Columbia are the largest export markets for the U.S.

As for by-products, the overall fall is largely due to an 18 per cent decline in exports to China, which remains the U.S's largest buyer of by-products.
