20 dead wild boar found with African Swine Fever

In Fagersta, 145 km north-west of Stockholm, the authorities continue to scour a large area for dead wild boar, helped by 400 hunters.

So far, 20 dead wild boar have been found infected with the African Swine Fever virus. All finds were made in a less restricted area, which is positive with a view to containing and controlling the infection.

The authorities hope to have fenced off the affected area within one month.

According to Swedish media, there is very little commercial pig production in this area.



New cases of African Swine Fever at pig farms

In Italy, the authorities continue to find new cases of African Swine Fever both among wild boar and at pig farms.

The new cases at pig farms in Lombardy are concerning for the Italian pig meat sector as Lombardy is the most pig-dense region in Italy accounting for half Italy's pig production.



May-June pig census

Eurostat has published the results of the May/June pig census for eight EU countries. Together with the figures for Serbia, the results are shown in the following table.

A total of 13 EU countries are expected to publish their figures for developments in the May/June pig population compared to May/June 2022. Figures for the other five EU countries together with the UK are expected to be published by Eurostat over the coming weeks.

PHILIPPINES

Fall in pig meat imports

The table below shows the official figures for the Philippines' imports of pig meat for Jan-June 2023 compared to the same period the previous two years.

As can be seen, there was a sharp fall of 34.3 per cent in imports of fresh/frozen pig meat in the first half year. However, imports were extraordinarily high in 2022 as a result of substantial problems with African Swine Fever and the consequent fall in the Philippines' pig meat production.

Imports from the EU and from Canada have been most affected. Imports from Brazil are largely unchanged.

Imports of by-products, however, increased slightly in the first half year 2023.

USDA: Fall in Spanish pig slaughtering continues to be expected for 2024

A recently published report from the USDA anticipates a continued fall in Spanish pig slaughtering in 2024.

According to the report, the fall is a consequence of new, stricter Spanish animal welfare regulations which exceed EU legislation.

According to the American agricultural attaché in Madrid, who quotes Spanish sources within the industry, Spain's new welfare regulations have tightened the space requirements in housing units and introduced stricter requirements for feed, water, feed automats, environmental conditions, etc.

The existing pig farms have two years to adapt to the new regulations.



Spanish authorities will try to quantify Spain's wild boar population

According to Pig 333, the Spanish authorities will try to quantify the country's wild boar population over the next two years. This should provide a better overview of the distribution of wild boar at regional level and the distribution between rural areas and urban environments.

The purpose of the project is to give the authorities a better basis for making strategic decisions about controlling the population.



Olymel closes cutting and processing plant

Last week, the Canadian Olymel announced that the company is closing its facility in Princeville in Quebec, which bones and packs pork. The plant employs 301 employees.

The closure is the latest in a series of closures that Olymel has carried out this year. Olymel has already closed a slaughtering facility and two processing plants for pig meat. All are located in Quebec.



Pig slaughtering fell in Q2 2023 by 1 per cent

Figures from the Brazilian authorities show that 14.08 million pigs were slaughtered in Q2 2023. This was a decrease of 1.0 per cent compared to the same quarter last year and a fall of 0.6 per cent compared to Q1 2022.

This is the first time in many years for a fall in Brazilian slaughtering to have occurred as there has been a constant rise since 2014.

Earlier this month, the Brazilian trade organisation, Brazilian Animal Protein Association (ABPA), stated that they expect Brazil's production of pig meat in 2023 to increase by 1.5 per cent to 5.1 million tonnes.

ABPA expects sales of pig meat to the home market to be unchanged at 3.85 million tonnes while exports are expected to rise by 12 per cent to 1.25 million tonnes.



According to Pig 333, Mexican imports of pig meat for January-July this year totalled 901,570 tonnes. This is a rise of 3.5 per cent compared to the same period in 2022. The value of imports increased by 8.0 per cent.

The rise in imports should be seen against the background of a strong and increased demand from the Mexican processing industry.

84 per cent comes from the U.S. followed by Chile and Brazil with 10.5 and 5.3 per cent of imports respectively.

AUSTRALIA

USDA expects rise in Australia's pig meat production and fall in imports in 2023 Last week, the USDA updated its outlook for the Australian beef and pig meat market.

As regards pig meat, the USDA expects a rise in Australia's pig meat production from 436,000 tonnes in 2022 to 470,000 in 2023 (+7.8 per cent) and 480,000 tonnes in 2024 (+2.1 per cent). However, at the start of the year, the USDA expected a slight fall of 2.5 per cent in Australia's pig meat production in 2023.

According to the USDA, Australia's pig meat imports totalled 241,000 tonnes (carcass weight) in 2022. For both 2023 and 2024, the USDA expects Australian imports to total 210,000 tonnes. Due to the high prices for pig meat from the EU, the EU expects imports from the U.S. to increase at the cost of pig meat from the EU.

This picture – with increased imports from the U.S. at the cost of pig meat from the EU – can also clearly be seen in Australian imports of pig meat (product weight) in the first half year 2023, which are shown below.
