Skeleton found with African Swine Fever virus

As can be seen from the above table showing the number of cases of African Swine Fever in Europe, a new incident of the virus has been reported in a wild boar in Sweden.

The discovery was made in the core area and concerns the skeleton of a wild boar that has tested positive for African Swine Fever. According to Karl Ståhl from the Swedish Veterinary Agency, the wild boar probably died in the summer of 2023.

The discovery does not change the current situation unless the infection spreads.

Karl Ståhl says that now the snow has melted, a further search of the area will be undertaken.

"As the virus can survive in a carcase for a long time and constitute a source of infection for healthy wild boars, it is important that older skeletons are found. When the search begins in earnest, it should come as

no surprise if there are more positive cases from wild boars that have been dead for some time", says Karl Ståhl.

RUSSIA

486,000 pigs culled in 2023 due to African Swine Fever

Pig Progress, citing Russia's Ministry of Agriculture, estimates that 486,000 pigs in Russia were culled because of African Swine Fever in 2023.

According to the Minister's speech, 49 Russian regions were affected by outbreaks of African Swine Fever in 2023. Some 68 outbreaks were confirmed at pig farms. However, this is an improvement on 2022 when 141 farms were affected by the virus.



Outbreak of Classical Swine Fever in north-eastern state

Pig333 reports that three cases of Classical Swine Fever were confirmed in the north-eastern Brazilian state of Piaui.

The authorities in the state are planning a vaccination programme to combat the disease.

The outbreaks have not affected Brazil's southern and western states which export pig meat.

CANADA

Pig producers and ministers dissatisfied with the new U.S. country of origin labelling scheme for meat

Canadian pig producer organisations and Canadian ministers have voiced their dissatisfaction with the U.S.'s new Voluntary Country of Origin Labelling scheme for meat, known as V-COOL.

The scheme, which comes into effect from 1 January 2026, means that meat products carrying a Made in the USA label must come from animals born, raised and processed in the U.S

According to Pig Progress, the Canadian Pork Council has expressed disappointment that comments and suggestions from the pig meat industry in both Canada and the U.S. were not taken into account in the legislation's final wording from March this year.

The Chairman of Manitoba Pork notes that the new legislation will significantly impact trade in the US/Canadian market. Manitoba sends 3 million piglets to the U.S. every year and exports pig meat to the U.S. for more than C\$ 400 million per year.

Canada's Agriculture and Trade Ministers issued a joint statement expressing their concern that the U.S. country of origin labelling scheme could cause disruption to the North American livestock market.

The National Pork Producers Council (NPPC) in the U.S. are also opposed to the country of origin labelling scheme. In this case, they are concerned that V-COOL will strain relations with foreign trading partners and could potentially lead to a retaliation against American meat products.

Moreover, the NPCC believes that the scheme will increase costs for American producers and will not help to create greater clarity for consumers about product origin.

With the USDA as the source, the tables below show ${\rm ^{6}}$ U.S. pig meat storage as at 31 March 2024 compared to the previous month and one year ago.

Total pig meat storage was 13 per cent down on one year ago but increased by 1 per cent compared to the previous month.

Beef storage as at 29 February was 10 per cent lower than one year ago and 3 per cent lower than the previous month.

As regards poultry, storage was 6 per cent lower than one year ago and is unchanged on the previous month.
