 **SPAIN**
African Swine Fever – Spain

According to the latest report from the Spanish authorities, the number of ASF-infected wild boar has increased to **252**, which is **11 more** than at the previous update. All new cases have been registered within the existing high-risk zone. Infection has been detected in one new municipality, which is already part of the high-risk zone.

In addition to the 252 positive cases, a total of 3,136 wild boar have tested negative. Just under 2,400 animals were caught or culled without clinical symptoms, while approximately 740 animals were examined through passive surveillance, which includes whole carcasses, remains found in nature, or animals showing symptoms.

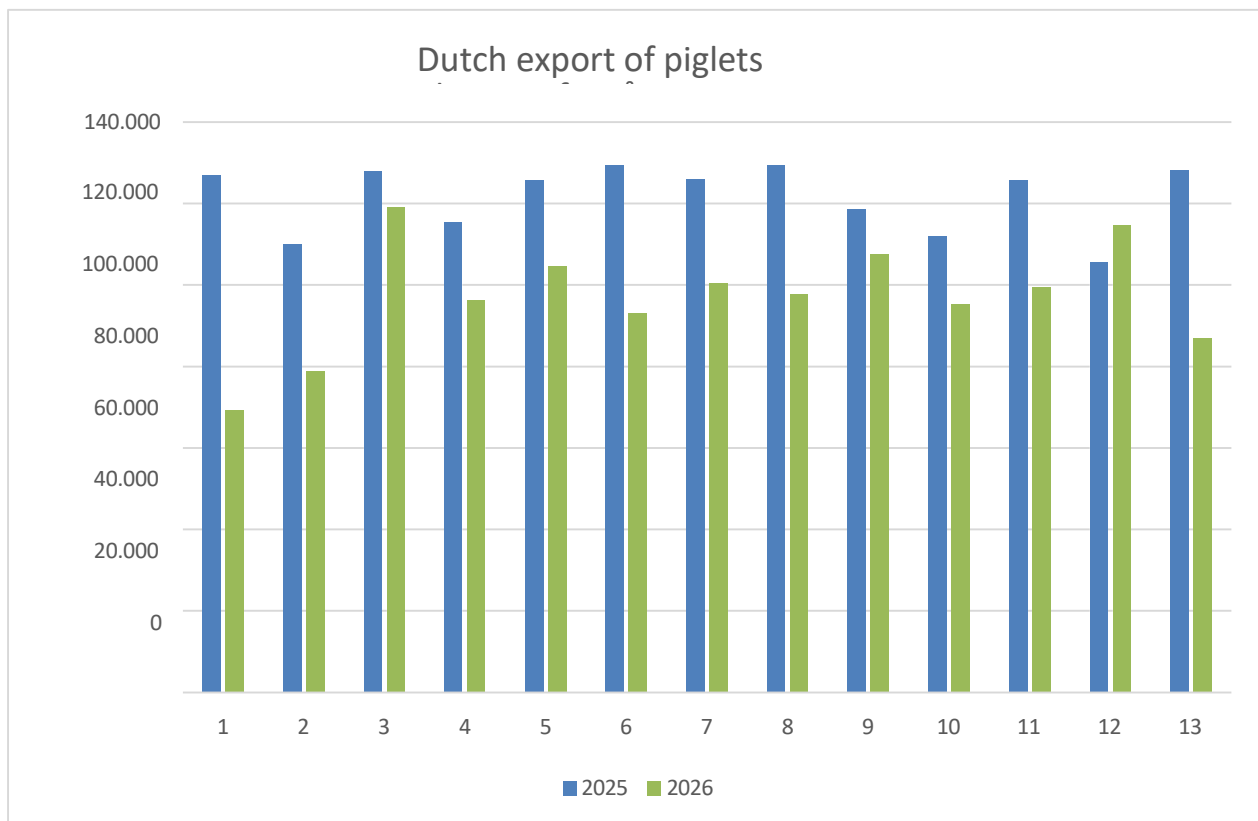
The export situation for Spanish pork remains unchanged. There have been no changes in which markets are open or closed to Spanish pork.


NETHERLANDS
Declining Exports of Piglets

Exports of Dutch piglets have declined from **just under 1.6 million piglets** in the first quarter of 2025 to **just under 1.3 million piglets** in the first quarter of 2026, corresponding to a decline of **20 per cent**.

According to data from RVO (Rijksdienst voor Ondernemend), the weekly export development shows that exports in almost all weeks of the first quarter of 2026 are below the level of the corresponding weeks the year before. Only in week 12 do exports exceed the level from 2025.

By destination country, exports to Spain have decreased by **30 per cent**, although Spain remains the most important market for Dutch piglets. Exports to Germany have declined by **just under 10 per cent** in the same period.



 **WORLD**

Expected Production, Consumption and Trade in Pork in 2026

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has published its semi-annual forecast for global production, global consumption and trade in pork in 2026.

The assessment covers a number of selected countries and is stated in tonnes carcass weight. Trade includes only fresh, frozen and processed pork, while China's significant imports of by-products are not included.

Pork Production

USDA expects total pork production in the selected countries to increase by **1 per cent** in 2026 compared with 2025. By comparison, production in 2025 was around **3 per cent** above the level of 2024. The expected growth in 2026 is driven mainly by increased production in the **United States, Brazil, China and Canada**, while production in the **EU** is expected to decline.

In **Brazil**, production is expected to increase by **3 per cent**, supported by good feed availability and strong international demand. In **China**, only a marginal increase in slaughterings is expected due to more pigs per litter. The sector continues to be under pressure from authorities to reduce production. In **Canada**, production is expected to rise by **2 per cent**, driven by a slightly increasing breeding herd and continued productivity improvements. In the **United States**, an increase in pigs per litter is also expected to offset a slightly smaller breeding herd and lift production by **1 per cent**.

In contrast, USDA expects pork production in the **EU** to decline by **1 per cent** in 2026. Weak economic conditions and abundant supplies of pork on the EU market have weakened profitability for pig producers. Falling prices at the end of 2025 – as a result of tariffs on exports to China and the outbreak of African swine fever in Spain – are expected to lead to further production reductions.

Pork Consumption

USDA expects global consumption in the selected countries to increase by **1 per cent** in 2026, following a **3 per cent** increase from 2024 to 2025.

This development reflects expectations of stable consumption in **China and the EU**, while the increase is mainly driven by higher pork consumption in markets such as **Mexico, the Philippines and Vietnam**. Pork consumption in the **United States** is also expected to rise slightly in line with moderate production growth.

Pork Imports

Global imports are expected by USDA to increase by **1 per cent** to **9.3 million tonnes** in 2026, representing more moderate growth than from 2024 to 2025.

Imports into **Mexico** are expected to continue growing, while **China's** imports are expected to decline sharply by **16 per cent** following several years of decline. At the same time, increased imports in other Asian markets such as the **Philippines and South Korea** are expected to contribute to an overall weak growth in global trade.

Pork Exports

Global exports are expected to remain largely unchanged at **10.4 million tonnes**.

Rising exports from **Brazil, the United States and Canada** are expected to offset a significant decline in **EU exports**.

Brazil is expected to increase exports by **7 per cent**, driven by improved market access and high competitiveness. **Canada** is expected to raise exports by **4 per cent** due to larger exportable supplies. **U.S. exports** are expected to increase by **3 per cent**, mainly driven by strong demand from **Mexico and Central America**, as well as new opportunities in Asia resulting from lower expected exports from the EU. USDA expects total **EU exports** to decline by **8 per cent** due to reduced supply and disease-related trade restrictions.

EU

Lower EU Pork Exports in January 2026

Based on data from **Eurostat's Comext database**, with the European Commission as the source, EU pork exports by categories, importers and exporters for **January 2026** are shown below, compared with the same month in 2025.

Exports are stated in **product weight**.

Denmark increased its exports outside the EU by **3 per cent** in January 2026 compared with January 2025. Danish exports grew particularly to the **Philippines, Taiwan and Ukraine**, while exports to **China and the UK** were lower.

Spain's exports outside the EU declined by **15 per cent** in January 2026 compared with the same month last year. The decline was mainly driven by lower exports to **China and Japan**, while exports to **South Korea, Vietnam and Singapore** increased significantly.

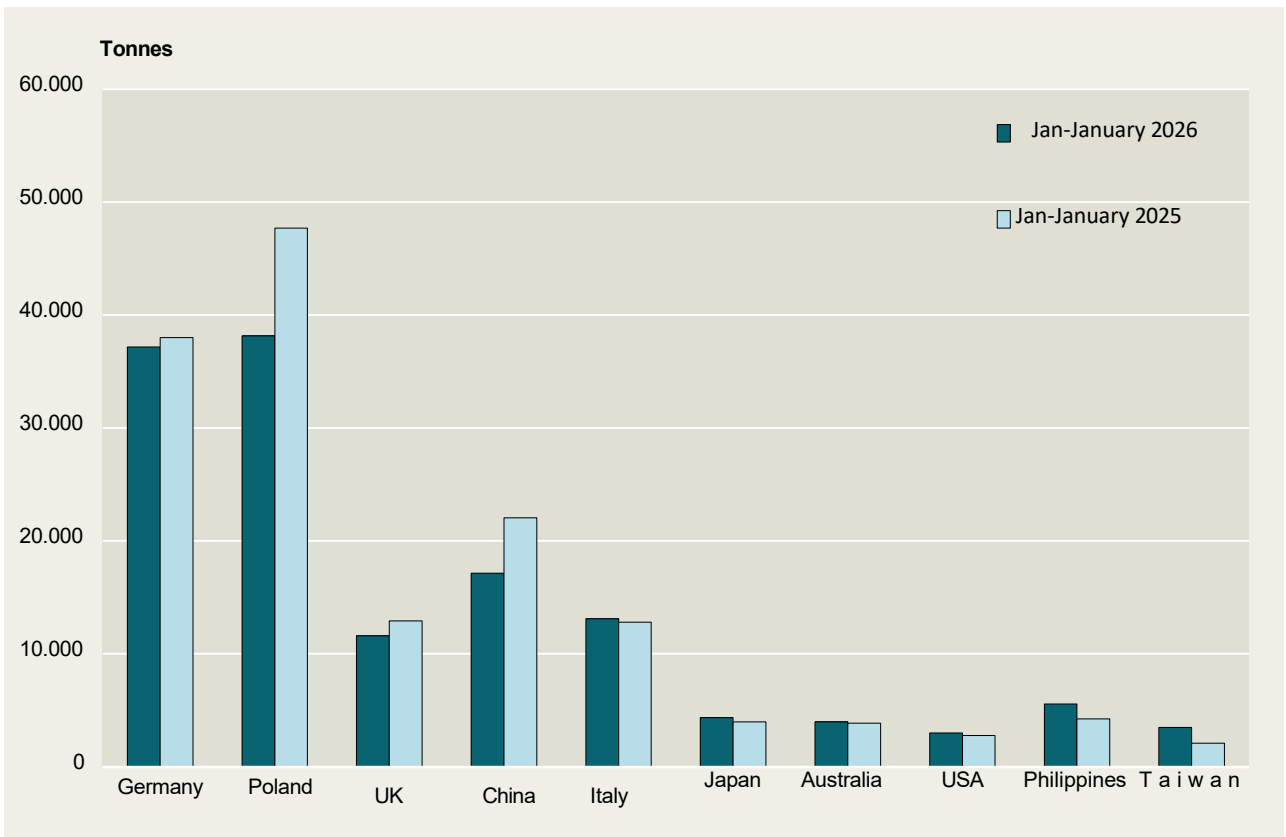
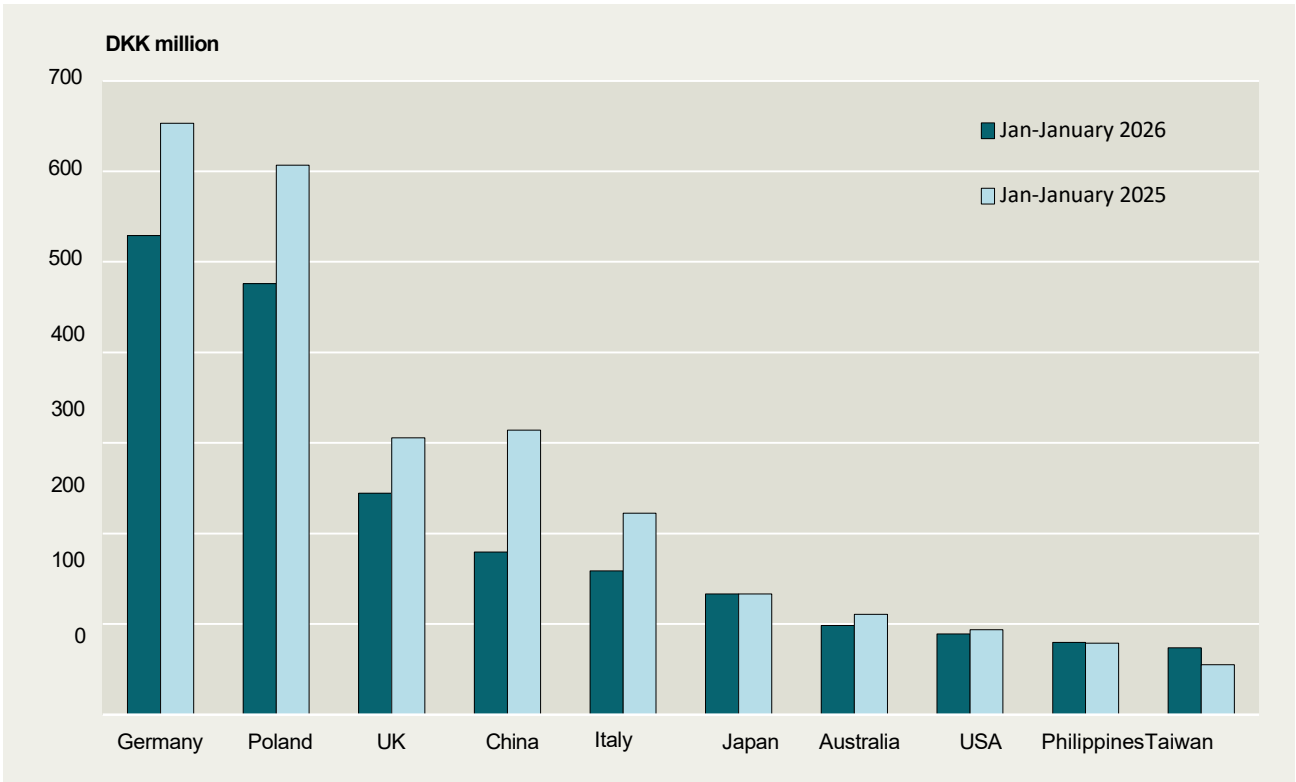

 **BRAZIL**
Continued Increase in Pork Exports

Below are the official figures for Brazil's exports of fresh and frozen pork for the period **January–March 2026**, compared with the same period in the two previous years.

The figures show that Brazilian pork exports continued to rise significantly in the first quarter of 2026. Total exports of fresh and frozen pork were **15.3 per cent higher** than in the same quarter last year, where exports had already increased compared with the previous year.

The development in the first quarter of 2026 reflects a substantial increase in exports particularly to the **Philippines and Japan**, while exports to **China** have declined. As a result, the Philippines and Japan have overtaken China as the largest export markets for Brazilian pork in volume terms.

 **TAIWAN**
Taiwan Again Declared Free of African Swine Fever

Taiwan has once again achieved status as an ASF-free area following recognition by the **World Organisation for Animal Health (WOAH)**, according to the country's Ministry of Agriculture.

Taiwan is therefore once again the only country in Asia free from all three serious pig diseases: **foot-and-mouth disease, classical swine fever and African swine fever**.

WOAH declared Taiwan free from all three diseases in May last year, but in October 2025 Taiwan recorded its first case of ASF in a pig herd. The herd was culled, and following extensive cleansing and control

measures, the case was closed in January 2026. Taiwan has now regained its ASF-free status.



SOUTH KOREA

Authorities and Processors Agree on Lower Pork Prices

According to international media, South Korean authorities have entered into an agreement with the slaughtering and processing industry to reduce pork prices during April in order to ease consumer prices. The price reductions cover key cuts such as **belly, neck cuts and hams**. Several companies have agreed to reduce prices by between **4 and just under 30 per cent** on a total of slightly more than **1,000 tonnes of pork**.

The agreement is the result of dialogue between the ministry and the industry aimed at stabilising the market, including maintaining appropriate stock levels, and will be supplemented by further initiatives to ensure more efficient distribution and reduce logistical costs.

UKRAINE

Strong Increase in Pork Imports

Based on **Ukrainian trade statistics**, Ukraine's imports of fresh/frozen pork (commodity code **0203**) for **January–March 2026** are shown below compared with the same quarter in the two previous years. Imports of fresh/frozen pork have increased significantly. **Denmark** is by far the largest exporter to Ukraine and accounts for slightly more than **half of Ukraine's pork imports** in the first quarter of 2026. However, imports remain relatively low compared with Ukraine's total annual pork production and consumption of more than **600,000 tonnes per year**.
