GERMANY

Stabilisation in German pig population

Last week, the German authorities published preliminary figures for the German pig population as at 3 November 2023 compared to one year ago.

The figures show that the sharply declining pig population of recent years has now been replaced by a more stable population.

The population stands at 21,216 million head as at 3 November 2023, which is 0.7 per cent lower compared to one year ago. With regard to the two previous censuses, the population – compared to last year – was down 10.1 per cent in November 2022 and 6.2 per cent in May 2023.

At -0.2 per cent, the breeding population as regards the November 2023 census was largely unchanged from last year. As regards 1st time gestating sows and gilts, there is thus an increase of 4.6 per cent and 5.6 per cent respectively. This should be viewed against the background of an uplift in the economy of pig production in 2023.

The unchanged breeding population encompasses differences in developments in individual German states. In Bayern and Lower Saxony, the breeding population declined whereas there was a rise in North-Rhine Westphalia and Saxony-Anhalt.

The number of pig farms in Germany in one year fell by 4.1 per cent from 16,900 to 16,200, reveals the preliminary figures. Finisher farms fell by 4.9 per cent over the year from 14,300 to 13,600 while sow farms fell 5.5 per cent from 5,500 to 5,200.

The number of boars was not estimated in 2023 because the random sample was too small.



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The results of the U.S. pig census from 1 December 2023 were published on 23 December by the USDA.

Compared to the corresponding census from one year ago, the result shows an unchanged population, while the breeding herd fell by 3.3. per cent.

Expected farrowings for the current quarter are 1.8 per cent lower than the same quarter last year, while the expected farrowings for the coming quarter are 1.2 per cent lower than last year.

The results of the 1 December pig census indicate that U.S. pig production for the 1st half year 2024 will be close to the level of the same period last year.

US analysts had previously indicated a slight fall (-0.7 per cent) in the overall US pig population in the December census.

It seems that the poor performance of U.S. pig production in 2023 has so far only resulted in a limited decline in the breeding population – a decline that is offset by rising productivity.



Pig meat storage 8 per cent lower compared to one year ago

With the USDA as the source, the table below shows the latest figures for U.S. storage of pig meat as at 30 November compared to the previous month and to one year ago.

Total pig meat storage at the end of November was 8 per cent lower compared to one year ago. Compared to the previous month, storage was down 5 per cent.

Beef storage as at 30 November was 2 per cent higher than the previous month but 13 per cent lower than one year ago. As regards poultry, storage fell by 8 per cent compared to the previous month but is 3 per cent higher than one year ago.

China's second largest pig producer, Wen's Food Group, has, through its subsidiary Jiarun Meat Qujing Jingbao Food Co, recently commissioned a new slaughter line for 1 million pigs per year, reports international news media.

This is part of a plan whereby Wen's – through its subsidiary – is to expand its substantial pig production by the slaughtering and subsequent processing of pig meat. Wen's subsidiary was established in Qujing City in 2019 and operates in South-Western China in Yunnan province.

The commissioning of the new line will bring slaughtering capacity up to 4 million pigs. A further three slaughtering lines with 1 million pigs for each has been planned. This will bring slaughtering capacity up to 7 million head. In 2022, Wen's produced 18 million pigs.

Wen's investments in its own slaughtering capacity have occurred at the same time that the company, like other large Chinese pig producers, realised massive losses on their pig production in 2023.



Purchase of pig meat

The Chinese authorities have announced that 23,000 tonnes of pig meat was purchased on 25 December for the state's strategic reserves.

This is an attempt to strengthen the pig price which has fallen to an unsustainable level for pig producers.

According to China's National Development and Reform Commission, the ratio between the pig price and the price of feed is somewhere between 5:1 and 6:1. The low price level resulted in the authorities announcing at the beginning of December that they were initiating measures to strengthen the pig price.



China is developing vaccine against African Swine Fever

Pig Progress reports that Chinese scientists are in the process of developing a new vaccine against African Swine Fever.

So far, only Vietnam has approved and used a vaccine against African Swine Fever.



Expects pig meat production to rise by 1 per cent next year

The Brazilian trade organisation, Brazilian Animal Protein Association (ABPA), expects Brazil's pig meat production to rise by 1 per cent to 5.15 million tonnes in 2024.

ABPA expects unchanged sales of pig meat to the home market of around 3.8 million tonnes next year, while exports of pig meat are expected to rise by 6.6 per cent to 1.3 million tonnes.

A rise in production of 2.3 per cent to 5.1 million tonnes is expected for 2023. According to ABPA, exports are estimated to rise by 8.9 per cent to 1.22 million tonnes this year.

BANGLADESH

First case of African Swine Fever

According to the World Organisation for Animal Health (WOAH), Bangladesh has officially reported its first case of African Swine Fever in the country. The virus was reported at a farm of 414 pigs in the town of Rangamati in the south-east of the country.
