EU

December pig census

Eurostat has published the results of the December 2023 pig census for all 27 EU countries. The results, which are divided into the total population, breeding sows and pregnant sows, are given in the table below. They also include Serbia.

The results indicate that EU slaughtering in the first half year 2024 will not be far from last year's total. With regard to the second half year, based on a slightly increasing breeding herd, EU slaughtering can be expected to be slightly higher than last year.

As always, the results of the pig census should be viewed with caution. They are based on random samples in the respective countries and for many countries, these are preliminary figures. Moreover, technical changes in individual countries' censuses make it difficult to draw comparisons with the previous year.

Authorities lower sow target from 41 million to 39 million

Reuters reports that China's Agriculture Ministry has lowered the target for the number of sows in the country from 41 million to 39 million.

The ministry also wants to prevent substantial fluctuations in the country's pig production and will trigger regulatory measures if the number of breeding sows increases or decreases too much.

Targets for the country's sow population will be adjusted depending on the changes in pig meat consumption and the efficiency of pig production.

The new regulation is a clear signal that the agriculture ministry believes there is significant overcapacity in the current pig population," says Even Pay, agriculture analyst at Trivium China.

In the latest estimate from the Ministry of Agriculture on China's pig population, the number of sows stood at 40.67 million as at the end of January. This was a fall of 6.9 per cent compared to one year ago and a fall of 1.8 per cent compared to the previous month.



Fitch Ratings: pig production to remain high in Q2 2024

The U.S. credit rating agency, Fitch Ratings, expects China's substantial pig production to continue in Q2 2024 and put pressure on Chinese pig prices.

Signs of a decline in production with some of the larger Chinese producers may modestly raise pig prices in the second half year, states Fitch, but uncertainty remains high.

Fitch points out that major producers wish to maintain their market position and recoup previous investments. Large breeders also have strong funding access, which allows them to withstand prolonged periods of losses.

The low fixed costs of smaller breeders, however, enable them to sustain operations despite weak prices.

According to Fitch, however, there are signs of a decline in production among some of the major producers such as New Hope, Tech-bank Food and Aonong Biotech, which have all disposed of pig-breeding-related assets since the second half year 2023.

Fitch expects continued pressure on earnings is likely to compel even the more cost-effective producers to reduce production over the coming 12 months – although whether this will reverse oversupply is doubtful.

For the time being, Fitch expects that demand for pig meat will remain stable in the Chinese market and the ongoing surplus supply will keep prices low, although modest improvements are likely in the second half year.



Tech-Bank Food sells shares

The Chinese pig producer, Tech-Bank Food, has sold a 30 per cent stake in Shiji Biotechnology to the Chinese feed producer, Tongwei Agriculture Development, reports international news media. The sales prices is stated at USD 25.4 million.

This is the second time for Tech-Bank Food to sell shares in Shiji Biotechnology. In 2022, the company sold its 51 per cent shareholding for USD 218 million.

Tech-Bank Food expects a loss for the financial year 2023 of between USD 390-435 million. The company has increased its sale of pigs by 61 per cent but the average price has fallen by 19 per cent, which has resulted in a substantial loss in the pig production business.



Wen's Food reports substantial losses in 2023

At an investor meeting, China's second largest pig producer, Wen's Food Group reported substantial losses in its pig operations in 2023, reports international news media.

Wen's revealed at the meeting that in the current market situation, they have switched their focus from increased production of breeding pigs to improving their quality.

💻 RUSSIA

Three Russian companies approved to export pig meat to China

Pig 333 reports that three Russian companies have been approved for export of pig meat to China.

The three companies are Miratorg Agro-Industrial Holding, Velikoluksky Meat Processing Plant and Tambovsky Bacon (part of Rusagro). Pig 333 sourced the information from the Russian veterinary authorities, Rosselkhoznadzor.



Pig meat storage 10 per cent lower compared to one year ago – but 10 per cent higher than the previous month

Drawing on the USDA as the source, the following table shows the latest calculations for U.S. pig meat storage as at 31 January 2024 compared to the previous month and to one year ago.

As at the end of January, total pig meat storage was 10 per cent lower than one year ago, but compared to the previous month, storage rose by 10 per cent.

Beef storage as at 31 January was 1 per cent lower than the previous month and 11 per cent lower than one year ago.

As for poultry, storage increased by 1 per cent on the previous month but is 4 per cent lower than one year ago.
