Record pig meat production in Q3 2023

Reuters reports that preliminary figures from China's National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) puts Chinese pig meat production in Q3 at 12.69 million tonnes.

This is the highest quarterly production since 2014 and a rise of 4.8 per cent compared to the same quarter last year, reports Reuters.

Pig meat production for the first three quarters of the year totals 43.01 million tonnes, 3.6 per cent higher than the same period last year.

It's not only pig meat production that is rising in China. For the first three quarters of the year, beef production rose by 5 per cent, poultry by 4 per cent and 5 per cent for mutton and lamb.

According to figures from NBS, meat production for the first three quarters totalled 69.74 million tonnes, which is a rise of 3.9 per cent compared to last year.



Unchanged sow population – but rising productivity increases production

Based on figures from China's Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Affairs, Reuters reports that China had 42.4 million sows at the end of September, little changed from the previous month.

At a press briefing, a spokesperson from the ministry said that the number of sows in September was 3.4 per cent higher than the normal level.

Productivity is also increasing, with each sow breeding 0.5 more pigs every year than the previous year, said the spokesperson. This means rising pig production despite the fact that the sow population is unchanged.

Increasing Chinese pig production has meant relatively low pig prices and poor returns for pig producers for most of 2023. According to the ministry spokesperson, pig prices may rebound in the fourth quarter, which is the peak consumption season. However, the spokesperson sees "no basis for a sharp rise". And after the Chinese New Year, he believes that there could be a decline in consumption as well as an increase in the number of pigs slaughtered.

So, according to the spokesperson, after the Chinese New Year, pig producers may once again be facing a period when financial losses in pig production may be greater than that of the same period last year. The spokesperson, therefore, has urged pig producers to adjust their production accordingly.

Chinese pig producers have lost money for most of this year, but rising pig prices and falling production costs in July and August meant that producers saw positive returns.

Prices have fallen again, however. According to China's National Reform and Development Commission, Chinese pig producers saw an average loss of 15.75 yuan (EUR 2.02) per pig in week 41.




Fall in China's pig meat imports in Q3 2023

The Chinese authorities have published import figures for Q3 2023. Pig meat imports in Q3 are at the lowest level since Q1 2019.

The chart below shows the quarterly development in China's imports of pig meat since Q1 2019 (fresh/frozen pig meat (product code 0203) and by-products (product code 020649)).

As can be seen, Chinese pig meat imports peaked from Q2 2020 to Q2 2021. There was, however, a slight rise in imports in the two first quarters of the year compared to the same quarters last year. But figures for Q3 are lower than the previous quarters.

Imports of fresh/frozen pig meat have varied by-products are more stable.



The tables below show Chinese imports of fresh/frozen pig meat and by-products for January-September 2023 compared to the same period in the previous two years.

As can be seen, the EU lost market share in the Chinese market to Brazil, USA and Canada in 2023.

USA

Smithfield prepares to go public again, US media reports

According to the Wall Street Journal, Chinese-owned Smithfield Foods may go public again in the United States and is working with U.S. banks to do so.

In 2013, Smithfield Foods was acquired by the Chinese WH Group for USD 4.7 billion.

PHILIPPINES

Authorities plan to extend the period of reduced import duties for pig meat

According to Pig Progress, citing Philippine press, the Philippine government plans to extend the period of reduced import duties for pig meat beyond 2023.

At a press conference, a spokesperson from the Philippine Department of Agriculture stated that they will coordinate with the private sector on the amount to be imported, but that "as a result of African Swine Fever, we need to import pig meat until the end of the year".

PHILIPPINES

Slight rise in pig population

At the latest pig census from 30 June 2023, the Philippines' pig population was put at 10.07 million – a slight rise of 1.4 per cent compared to the corresponding census one year ago.

Around 67.5 per cent of the pig population comes from small-scale productions, while the remaining 32.5 per cent of the population comes from semi or fully commercial pig farms.

USDA previously estimated that in 2024, the Philippines will see a gradual return to more normal production following major problems with African Swine Fever. For 2024, the USDA expects Philippine pig meat production to reach 970,000 tonnes against 950,000 tonnes in 2023 and 925,000 tonnes in 2022.

However, the USDA states that if the authorities succeed in rolling out a successful vaccine strategy, production can increase faster.



AMI: Continued positive earnings for German piglet producers in October

Model calculations from AMI (agricultural market information company) in Germany for monthly earnings for German pig producers show continuing positive results for October.

For October, the profit for a 25 kg piglet is calculated at EUR 14.20 per piglet. Earnings are put at 86.40 euros/pig, while production costs are put at 72.20 euros/pig.

However, this is a fall in profits from September when profits were calculated at 20.50 euros/pig. Profits peaked in the summer months when they reached over 35 euros/pig.

According to the model calculation, piglet producers have been showing a profit since January this year. However, this follows a long period of losses since the mid-2020s.

SOUTH KOREA

Increasing imports from North America at the cost of Europe

The table below shows the official figures for South Korea's imports of fresh/frozen pig meat for Jan-Sept 2023 compared to the same period in 2022 and 2021.

As can be seen, South Korea's total imports of fresh/frozen pig meat for the first nine months of 2023 were slightly lower than the same period last year, but higher than two years ago.

However, there have been major shifts in imports from individual countries. Imports from the U.S., Canada, Mexico and Brazil have increased this year while imports from the EU have declined.

In 2022, South Korea resumed imports from Belgium after the country was declared free from African Swine Fever.

Increasing exports of pig meat

The table below shows the official figures for Brazil's exports of fresh/frozen pig meat for January-September 2023 compared to the same period in 2022 and 2021.

As can be seen, Brazil's pig meat exports in 2023 were higher than the same period in the previous two years.

Apart from China and Argentina, there has been a marked rise in exports from Brazil to a number of markets in Asia and South America.

Recently, the Dominican Republic has also opened up its market to Brazilian pig meat. The Dominican Republic is seeing rising imports of pig meat after the country was hit by African Swine Fever in 2021.
