Preliminary figures from two German states show a continuing decline in Germany's pig population The May census's preliminary figures for the pig population in North Rhine-Westphalia and Baden-Württemberg shows a continuing decline in the German pig population, reports ISN in Germany.

The preliminary figures for both states show a 6 per cent decline in the total pig population while the breeding sow population is down by 7-8 per cent compared to last year.

During the next few weeks, figures will be published for the pig population of the other German states. However, the results from North Rhine-Westphalia and Baden- Württemberg indicate that we will see a similar substantial decline when the total result for the whole of Germany is published at that time.

SWEDEN

Stable pig slaughtering in Q1 2023

Statistics from the Swedish Board of Agriculture show that Swedish pig slaughtering remains stable when compared to the same period last year.

According to the figures, Swedish slaughtering rose by 1.3 per cent in Q1 2023 compared to the same quarter last year. For 2022 as a whole, slaughtering rose by 0.8 per cent compared to 2021. In 2021, there was a similar rise of 1.1 per cent.

The world's largest pig producers

With the breeding company Genesus as the source, the table below lists the largest global pig producers, i.e. with more than 100,000 sows. 50 production companies are on the list, which is largely dominated by China.

Some 24 of the 50 largest production companies are headquartered in China. Third on the list, Smithfield/WH Group whose head office is in the US, is also Chinese owned. In addition to 24 from China,

 $\ensuremath{^{5}}$ Europe only Spain with three producers appears on there are 12 from the US and 4 from Brazil. From the list.

Until last year, the largest pig producers usually saw annual progress in the number of sows. But in the past two years, a number of major Chinese pig production companies, in particular, have reduced their sow numbers.

Fall in imports of pig meat

After being hard hit by African Swine Fever in 2019 and 2020, Vietnam has now seen a re-establishment of its pig population. The rise in production also means less need for imports.

According to S&P Global, Vietnam's imports of pig meat fell by 20 per cent to 123,000 tonnes in 2022. For the first four months of 2023, imports of 21,250 tonnes have been reported, which is a fall of 41 per cent compared to the same period last year.

In contrast to several other Asian countries, Vietnam allows imports of pig meat from countries with African Swine Fever, e.g. Russia and Germany.

For the first four months of 2023, imports of pig meat from Russia amounted to 8,477 tonnes. This is a rise of 8 per cent compared to last year. By contrast, imports from Brazil fell by 63 per cent to 5,340 tonnes while imports from Germany fell by 41 per cent to 4,153 tonnes, reports S&P Global.
