Outbreak of African Swine Fever ravages the Balkans

As can be seen from the table above, there are still many outbreaks of African Swine Fever in the Balkans where a number of small farms in Bosnia-Herzegovina, Croatia, Serbia and Romania have recently been affected.

The many cases in the Balkans mean that so far this year, according to the Commission's calculations, almost four times as many outbreaks have been detected at pig farms than were detected in the whole of last year. Moreover, the number of outbreaks in farms is already higher this year than for the whole of 2021.



New research offers hope of better control of African Swine Fever

Scientists at the University of Edinburgh and the Friedrich Loffler Institute have found a pig gene for the replication of the African Swine Fever virus.

The scientists believe that the new discovery will provide a better understanding of the disease and make it possible to breed pigs that are resistant to the virus in future.

African Swine Fever confirmed at a pig farm in Lombardy

Earlier this summer, the first case of African Swine Fever was found in Lombardy in a dead wild boar.

The disease has now been confirmed at a pig farm in the North Italian province, where a farm of 166 pigs is reported to be affected.

🛃 CANADA

Pig census 1 July

Last week, the authorities in Canada published the results of the pig census carried out on 1 July 2023.

The census shows a decline of 1.0 per cent in the population of piglets and finishers while the breeding herd fell by 0.4 per cent.

On 1 July 2023, 7,100 pig farms were recorded in Canada, which is a decline of 2.9 per cent compared to one year ago when the number of pig farms stood at 7,310.

The number of pig slaughterings for the 1st half year 2023 amounted to 11.1 million, a rise of 0.2 per cent compared to the 1st half year 2022.

Exports of live pigs from Canada amounted to 3.3 million for the 1st half year, which is 0.8 per cent more than the 1st half year 2022.



USDA expects American pig meat production in 2024 to be largely unchanged

In their latest Outlook Report, the USDA expects American pig meat production to be largely unchanged from 2023. For 2023, the USDA expects a modest increase in production of 1 per cent.

The table below shows the USDA's forecast for quarterly pig slaughtering in 2023 and for the 1st half of 2024 compared to the previous two years.

The table below shows the USDA's forecast for U.S. production of various meat types in 2023 and 2024.

As can be seen, a significantly lower production of beef is expected in both 2023 and 2024. A rise in poultry production is expected, however.

Fall in pig meat storage

With the USDA as the source, the table below shows the latest calculations for American pig meat storage as at 31 July compared to the previous month and one year ago.

Storage as at the end of July was 3 per cent lower than the previous month and 10 per cent lower compared to one year ago.

Beef storage, however, is 2 per cent higher compared to the previous month but 18 per cent lower compared to one year ago. As regards poultry, storage was 1 per cent down on the previous month and 4 per cent higher compared to one year ago.

China asks Brazil to reduce the number of lists of plants it wants approved for export to China

According to the Brazilian Minister of Agriculture, the Chinese authorities have asked Brazil to reduce the number of lists of plants seeking permission to export meat to China.

China believes that one list with fewer Brazilian plants will help speed up the Chinese approval process.

The Brazilian Minister of Agriculture states that the Brazilian authorities initially sought approval for exports to China from 77 Brazilian plants. The Minister will now contact the Brazilian meat industry with a view to shortening the two lists.

In the first half year, Brazil increased its exports of pig meat to China by 19 per cent to 204,000 tonnes. Total Brazilian pig meat exports increased by 15 per cent to 526,000 tonnes over the same period.

French pig meat approved for export to Australia

According to the French Ministry of Agriculture and the French trade organisation, Culture Viande, Australia has now given the go-ahead to pig meat from France.

According to Culture Viande, approval comes after several years of negotiations between the two countries on sanitary conditions and follows a deadlock in negotiations between Australia and EU on a future trade agreement.



Spain introduces law on mandatory camera surveillance at slaughterhouses

International news media report that Spain's parliament has passed a new law which makes camera surveillance at Spanish pig and poultry slaughterhouses mandatory.

The reason for the new law is the growing public concern about animal welfare in the country and increased interest from consumers in the conditions under which food is produced.

The law means that slaughterhouses must have video surveillance installed in all areas of the slaughterhouse where live animals are present, including incoming transport, the driving corridor as well as stunning, sticking/exsanguination.

The new law comes into force at major slaughterhouses at the end of August. Smaller plants have one year to implement the adjustments.



Pig meat production rose by 5.9 per cent in first half year

According to the Director of Russia's National Union of Pork Producers, Yuri Kovalev, Russia's pig meat production rose by 5.9 per cent in the first half year of 2023 compared to the first half year of 2022.
