Buy-out scheme for pig farms approved by EU Commission

Pig333 reports that the EU Commission has approved a buy-out scheme for pig farms in Flanders.

With the aim of reducing nitrogen emissions, EUR 200 million has been allocated for the buy-out of small and medium-sized pig farms in Flanders. The scheme is expected to run until 30 June 2025.



Rising imports of pig meat

According to international news media, Serbia's pig meat imports in 2022 rose to a new record level of 51,074 tonnes, an increase of 52 per cent compared to 2021.

More than 50 per cent came from Spain, i.e. some 28,312 tonnes. This is a rise of 69 per cent compared to 2021.

African Swine Fever is a major problem in Serbia. In 2022, 107 cases were reported at pig farms and 146 cases among wild boar. In 2023, for the first two months of the year, 11 cases were detected in pig farms and 90 cases among wild boar.

The latest pig census from December 2022 shows a 7 per cent decline in both Serbia's overall pig and sow populations, which suggests a continued increase in Serbian pig meat imports in 2023.



German pig slaughtering fell by 9.2 per cent in 2022

With AMI as the source, the table below shows the development in German pig slaughtering for the period 2015-2022.

Slaughtering amounted to 47.1 million head in 2022, which is a fall of 4,773 million and corresponding to 9.2 per cent compared to 2021. The unbroken, declining trend in slaughtering since 2016 therefore continues and intensified sharply in 2022. In the previous years, slaughtering fell by 2-3 per cent.

The decline in 2022 can solely be attributed to a fall in Germany's own pig production. The number of imported finishers thus increased in 2022 following substantial falls since 2016.

Germany's cattle slaughtering also saw a significant decline in 2022, i.e. 7.8 per cent down on 2021.



Pig census November 2022

The German authorities have just published final figures for the German pig population following the November 2022 census.

Compared to the preliminary figures published in December, there has been a slight readjustment for most pig categories. Where the preliminary figures showed an overall decline in the total population of 10.2 per cent, the final figures now show a decline of 10.1 per cent. For pregnant sows, the decline has been adjusted to 10.7 per cent, where the preliminary figures in December showed a decline of 10.9 per cent.

The number of pig farms in Germany remains at 16,900, which is a decline of 10.1 per cent in a year. Finisher farms have declined by 8.9 per cent in one year, from 15,700 to 14,300, while sow farms have declined by 11.3 per cent from 6,200 to 5,500.

USDA forecasts an unchanged production and a slight rise in Chinese pig meat imports in 2023 Last week, the USDA updated its forecast for China's production, consumption and trade in pig meat in 2023.

The USDA forecasts pig slaughtering in China to total 701.5 million in 2023 and pig meat production to amount to 55.5 million tons. This is more or less unchanged compared to 2022, but an increase of 17 per cent compared to 2021. In 2022, slaughtering figures were stated at 700.0 million and production at 55.4 million tonnes. In 2021, the number of slaughterings totalled 600.0 million and production at 47.5 million tonnes.

When it comes to China's pig meat imports (excluding by-products and calculated in carcase weight), the USDA forecasts imports amounting to 2.2 million tonnes in 2023. This is a slight increase of 3.5 per cent compared with 2022, when imports totalled 2.125 million tonnes.

The USDA has assumed that pig meat consumption in the Chinese market in 2023 will amount to 57.55 million in 2023. This is largely unchanged from 2022, when consumption amounted to 57.434 million tonnes, but an increase of 11 per cent compared with 51,724 million tonnes in 2021.

As regards consumption, the USDA forecasts an uplift in demand now that all Covid restrictions have been lifted. Consumption was under pressure in the winter months: first as a result of the Covid restrictions and then as a consequence of many people falling ill immediately after the lifting of restrictions.



The USDA forecasts a slight decline in Australian pig meat production and unchanged imports in 2023

The USDA forecasts a slight decline of 2.5 per cent in Australian pig meat production with unchanged Australian pig meat imports in 2023.

In an updated report from last week on the Australian market, the USDA forecasts that Australian pig meat production in 2023 will amount to 425,000 tonnes compared to 436,000 tonnes in 2022.

The USDA has put Australian pig meat imports at 240,000 tonnes in 2023, which is virtually unchanged from 2022, when the imports, according to the USDA's calculations, amounted to 241,000 tonnes.
