African Swine Fever hits pig production in Serbia, Croatia and Bosnia-Herzegovina

As can be seen from the table on page 2, a number of pig production businesses in Serbia, Croatia and Bosnia-Herzegovina were hit by African Swine Fever in July.

Last week, the veterinary authorities from the three countries met in Bosnia to discuss the situation at which they agreed to make a joint request to the European Commission and WHO for financial assistance to help the countries' affected pig producers.

The Croatian government has already approved a EUR 7.5 million aid package to compensate the affected pig producers in the country.



Authorities approve African Swine Fever vaccine for commercial use

As the first country in the world to do so, the authorities in Vietnam have approved two newly developed vaccines against African Swine Fever for commercial use.

According to the authorities, extensive tests among pig producers across the country have shown that the two vaccines are 95 per cent effective against African Swine Fever.



Surprising rise in pig population

According to Reuters, whose source is China's Agriculture Ministry, the Chinese pig population stood at 435.17 million head in Q2, which is a rise of 1.1 per cent compared to one year ago when the population stood at 430.57 million head.

The sow population at the end of June was put at 42.96 million head, which is a rise of 0.9 per cent compared to 42.58 million at the end of May. Compared to one year ago, the sow population has risen by 0.4 per cent from 42.77 million.

Bearing in mind the poor returns from pig production, it is surprising that both China's breeding herd and the total number of pigs showed increases at the end of June.



Pig producers publish preliminary financial results with substantial losses

Last week, the two major Chinese pig producers, Muyan Foodstuff and New Hope Liuhe, published their preliminary results for H1 2023 at the Shenzhen Stock Exchange. They showed substantial losses.

The two companies expect losses for H1 of between 2.55 and 3.25 billion yuan and 2.79 to 2.99 billion yuan. The losses are, however, less than for the same period last year. Both companies attribute this to a fall in production costs.



Decline in pig meat storage

With the USDA as the source, the table below shows the latest figures for U.S. pig meat storage as at 30 June compared to the previous month and to one year ago.

At the end of June, total pig meat storage was 8 per cent lower than the previous month and 9 per cent lower than one year ago. Compared to one year ago, only belly storage was higher.

At the end of June, beef storage was 3 per cent lower than the previous month and 20 per cent lower than one year ago.

By contrast, poultry storage was 5 per cent higher than the previous month and 10 per cent higher than one year ago.

Fall in cattle population

The latest U.S. cattle census from 1 July shows a total population of 95.9 million, which is a fall of 3 per cent compared to one year ago.

The population has not been lower since 2014 and has fallen by 7 per cent since 2019.

Rabobank: consumption remains under pressure

In the latest quarterly report from July, Rabobank states that the global pig meat market is being affected by weak economic growth, fall in demand, recurrent outbreaks of disease, and productivity problems.

Weak economic growth has a negative impact on demand. Slower exports, rising unemployment and a lack of investor confidence are all causing problems in China, South-East Asia and some South American countries. In North America and Europe, demand is being squeezed by high food inflation.

In all cases, consumers are changing their shopping patterns, i.e. trading down and buying smaller portions and cheaper products. Pig meat – which is less expensive than beef and many fish and seafood products, but dearer than poultry – is maintaining a relatively stable share on consumers' plates, reports Rabobank.

In Asia and Europe, continued outbreaks of African Swine Fever are having a negative impact on pig meat production in Asia and Europe. Moreover, PRRS remains a challenge in Spain.

Rabobank expects global trade in pig meat in the second half of 2023 will be lower than the same period last year. This is due to the fact that China's imports will be squeezed by substantial reserves and weak domestic demand, while Europe's exports will be limited by a fall in pig meat production.
