African Swine Fever

Last week Russia reported one outbreak of African Swine Fever among wild boar in the west of the country.



Erection of fence expected to begin in September

Last week, Poland's Minister of Agriculture, Krzysztof Jurgiel, announced that work is expected to begin in September on erecting a fence to prevent wild boar from Ukraine and Belarus entering Poland.

The announcement from the Minister follows a meeting in Warsaw between the EU's Agriculture Ministers, the EU Commissioner Vytenis Andriukaitis and the Agricultural Ministers of Ukraine, Belarus and Russia.

Following the meeting, Andriukaitis stated that EU countries must fight against the spread of African Swine Fever by stepping up border controls, hunting practices and boar population control.



China imposes higher tariffs on US pig meat

As a countermeasure to President Trump's import restrictions on Chinese steel and aluminium, China has imposed higher tariffs on a number of US products, including pig meat.

Pig meat is now subject to additional tariffs of 25% over and above the existing tariffs of 12% for cuts and 20% for by-products.



Pig census 1 March 2018

The results of the US pig census from 1 March 2018 have been published. They show a rise of 3.1% in the total pig population with a rise in the breeding herd of 1.7%.

Expected farrowings for the current quarter are 2.1% higher compared to one year ago, while for the coming quarter, there is a rise of 1.4% compared to the same quarter last year.

The results of the pig census are on a par with previous forecasts and confirm that 2018 will see a rise in US pig slaughterings of between 3-4 per cent compared to the previous year.

The rise in US pig production is taking place against a backdrop of periods in 2016 and 2017 of relatively low feed prices and profitable pig production combined with the construction of new US pig abattoirs.

US sources have previously estimated that the opening of a number of new abattoirs in the US means that US slaughtering capacity is at least 7% higher in 2018 compared to 2017.



Negotiations begin on a free trade agreement with Mercosur

Last week, Canada began negotiations with Mercosur (Brazil, Argentina, Uruguay and Paraguay) on a future free-trade agreement.

The negotiations are taking place at the same time as Canada – following a request from the United States – has begun NAFTA renegotiations and at the same time as Mercosur is finalising a free-trade agreement with the EU.



Australia's Trade Minister anticipates free trade agreement with UK

According to the Australian media, Australia's Trade Minister, following a meeting in London with the UK's Secretary of State for International Trade, Liam Fox, has expressed the urgency of starting negotiations on a free trade agreement with the UK.

Following the meeting, Australia's Trade Minister Steve Ciobo announced that he hopes a free trade agreeemnt between Australia and the UK can be implemented on 1 January 2021 when the UK leaves the EU. At any rate, the agreement should be negotiated during the transition period which begins on 30 March next year.

Ciobo also expects the EU to take steps to negotiate a free trade agreement between the EU and Australia in the middle of next year.

SOUTH KOREA

Foot and mouth disease at a pig farm

Last week, the authorities in South Korea reported one case of foot and mouth disease at a pig farm comprising 1059 pigs in the city of Gimpo, 30 km north-west of Seoul. All pigs have been culled.

No further outbreaks are expected because South Korea inoculates its pigs and cattle against the virus.

This time, the infection was caused by the type A virus. Last year, a number of cattle were infected by the type O virus. Between 2010 and 2016, there were a number of cases of foot and mouth disease in the country caused by the type A virus.



Fall in pig prices

Asian Agribusiness reports strongly falling pig prices in Vietnam, which means that many of the country's pig producers are leaving the industry.

According to figures from Vietnam's Ministry of Agriculture, prices for live pigs in March fell by \$0.04-\$0.13 per kg live weight to \$1.30 per kg live weight. As production costs amount to \$1.23 per kg live weight, this means that producers are once again losing money.

The fall comes despite the decline in pig production in the initial months of 2018. By contrast, increasing prices and growing optimism were reported among Vietnamese pig producers for the first two months of the year. The recent fall in production is a consequence of an economically tough year in 2017.



15 outbreaks of foot and mouth disease

The Mongolian authorities have reported 15 cases of foot and mouth disease in the first months of 2018. The cases are spread across the country and have affected cattle, goats and sheep.
