MARKET SITUATION

Europe: Trade in pork legs took place at increasing prices this week. Trade in shoulders and manufacturing meat also saw increasing prices, whereas trade in other cuts was at unchanged or slightly increasing prices.

UK: Trade in the UK bacon market remains stable.

Third countries: Stable demand from China and good demand from Japan is reported. As regards other markets, demand is more subdued.

An analysis of export data shows that last year, Asian trading houses, including the Chinese state-owned COFCO, purchased 45 per cent of Brazilian exports of maize, soya beans and soybean meal.

Wens to expand pig production in Yunnan province

China's biggest livestock producer, Guangdong Wens Foodstuff Group, is expanding by setting up new pig production operations in the south-western province of Yunnan.

Wens has signed an agreement with the authorities in the city of Qujing in Yunnan province for the establishment of eight facilities that will produce 5 million pigs per year. In addition to the pig farms, plans also include a mill, producing 2m tonnes of feed, administration buildings and staff accommodation.

Back in April, Wens signed an agreement with the authorities in Honghe – also in Yunnan province – to establish facilities <u>producing</u> 3 million pigs per year. Along with a number of north-eastern provinces, Yunnan province and Guizhou province (also in the south-west) have been designated as areas with potential for increased pig production.

Last year, Wens produced 15.35m pigs, 744m chickens and 18.74m ducks. The company recently announced that its end goal was to produce 10 per cent of China's annual pig production of 500m pigs.

Significant potential for pig meat exports to China

At the recent World Pork Expo in Des Moines, Iowa, Professor Dermot Hayes forecast significant potential for increased US pig meat exports to China in the long-term, accounting for 30-40 per cent of the country's pig meat consumption.

China plans to move livestock production away from densely populated areas in the eastern part of the country to more remote areas in the west. However, this change will present a very difficult task given the current infrastructure and other factors in the short-term will mean a fall in Chinese pig meat production.

NPPC warns politicians against rejecting TPP free trade agreement

At a hearing of the Trade Committee of the US Congress, the President of the National Pork Producers Council (NPPC), John Weber, warned_of the consequences of Congress rejecting the Trans Pacific Partnership (TPP), recently_agreed among twelve countries around the Pacific.

According to Weber, the TPP agreement <u>represents</u> the biggest commercial opportunity ever for the US pig meat industry. The agreement will ensure access for US pig meat to a market of 500m people and increased exports will_create more than <u>domestic</u> 10,000 jobs.

He pointed out that the EU and China are also negotiating free trade agreements in the region. TPP will set a precedent for other free trade agreements and if the US does not approve the proposed agreement,, the country will lose market share and other countries will decide on the framework for free trade regulations in the future.

Concern over antibiotic resistance in pig genes

Concern has been expressed at the news that the USDA has detected the MDR-1 gene in two samples of pig intestines. This gene produces resistance to the antibiotic colistin, which is the antibiotic of last resort in human medication, if bacteria have proved to be resistant to other antibiotics.

USDA has begun an investigation into the MDR 1 gene in samples from pigs, cattle and poultry after the gene was found in China last autumn but claims that, because 1,400 samples were tested, the findings are not normal. The fear is, however, that the bacteria <u>may</u> mutate causing resistance to all antibiotics.
